OBJECTIVES:

General objective of the conference is to inform Macedonian society about the USAID efforts to help the Macedonian civil society combat corruption.

Specific objective is to present USAID Macedonia Anti-Corruption Program's objective, expected results and planned activities to State institutions, civil society organizations, media and other stakeholders working in the field of anti-corruption.

BACKGROUND:

USAID Macedonia Anti-Corruption Program is implemented by Macedonian Center for International Cooperation (MCIC). Program partners are Institute for Democracy Societas Civilis - Skopje (IDSCS), Transparency Macedonia and Association for Democratic Initiative – Gostivar (ADI).

Period of implementation is July 2013 – April 2016. The U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) awarded the sum of \$583,972 to provide support for a program.

The overall program goal is democratic Macedonia free of corruption. The specific program objective is to inform and educate CSOs and citizens on how to hold State institutions accountable and contribute to their higher integrity.

The project includes several innovative working methods which will be implemented for the first time in Macedonia. One of them is the Corruption Monitoring System (CMS), invented in Bulgaria by the Center for Study of the Democracy, which provides a comprehensive analysis and gather detailed information on the types, levels, and trends of corruption in a given country.
