





# Typology of organized crime in Bulgaria

	Violent entrepreneurs	Oligarchs
Background	Former athletes, police officers, ex-convicts	Former state-owned enterprise managers, party leaders, secret police officers.
Tools	Violence	Corrupting political elites
Market	Dividing territories	Monopoly and oligopoly on national level



# Typology of organized crime in Bulgaria

	Violent entrepreneurs	Oligarchs
Yugoslavia embargo - export	From taxing individual shuttle traders to mules with personal vehicles to fuel tanks	Tankers and train goods
Internal market	Petrol stations and wholesales	Petrol stations chains and wholesales
Industry		<ul><li>Control on ways in and out</li><li>Purchase of debts</li></ul>



# Legalization of the criminal entrepreneurs in Bulgarian energy sector

- Privatization of small Hydro electrical power plants and local companies that provide central heating
- Public procurements from Bulgarian energy companies
- Private logging companies
- Renewable energy (sources),
  - Build of small hydro, wind and solar parks
  - Control over local and national authorities
  - Usage of money from real estate business
