
Energy Security Challenges for SEE

Energy Security Status Quo



Overall Energy Dependence



Excessive Natural Gas Dependence







Current ratio of selected SOEs in the area of power production





Srbijagaz – a case study example of bankrupt and loss-making SOE







Red Flags

- Low current, liquidity and quick ratio means payment trouble
- Large debt to assets ratio high leverage and lack of longterm sustainability
- Negative return on assets and equity means a loss-making company
- Regulatory regimes subsidizing energy prices remove the SOEs incentives to invest
- Public procurement is marred with corrupt procedures and concentration of tender winners.
- Transparency and accountability are purposefully eroded in the governance of large energy infrastructure projects
