


- Excessive dependence on energy imports

Energy Security Status Quo





Overall Energy Dependence







- Political meddling in the day-to-day operations of energy SOEs
- Non-transparent staffing procedures for CEOs and Board of Directors
- Prevalent Political affiliations and conflicts of interest
- Limited transparency and management accountability

Iber Lepenc, Kosovo, board member	Ejup Visoka was the member of LDK Podujevë Branch Presidency since the establishment of LDK
Iber Lepenc, Kosovo, board member	Mehdi Jonuzi was the LDK candidate for mayor in Mitrovicë municipality in the last local elections of 2013
ELEM, Macedonia, chair of the board member	Dejan Boshkovski is a member of the ruling party VMRO-DPMNE
Elektroprivreda BiH, BiH	Member of the Executive Board of ruling party in BiH (SDA)
Elektroprivreda RS, BiH	Member of ruling party in Republic of Srpska(SNSD)
Elektroprivreda HZHZ, BiH	Member of ruling party in BiH (HDZ)
FERK, BiH	Close relative to the Co-president of ruling party in Federation of BiH who is also member of Council of Ministers in BiH (HDZ)
EPS, Serbia, CEO	Aleksandar Obradovic is a member of the ruling party (Serbian Progressive Party).
Srbijagas, Serbia, CEO	Dusan Bajatovic is a vice president of the second largest party in the Government (Socialist Party of Serbia).
EMS, Serbia, CEO	Nikola Petrovic is a close friend of the Prime Minister (he was the best man at PM's wedding, and PM is a godfather to his child)

Red Flags

- Low current, liquidity and quick ratio means payment trouble
- Large debt to assets ratio – high leverage and lack of long-term sustainability
- Negative return on assets and equity means a loss-making company
- Regulatory regimes subsidizing energy prices remove the SOEs incentives to invest
- Public procurement is marred with corrupt procedures and concentration of tender winners.
- Transparency and accountability are purposefully eroded in the governance of large energy infrastructure projects
