PRE-INTEGRATION

- Housing/settlement in camps: operated by UNHCR, national government, municipalities and NGOs
- Relocation service: UNHCR and national governemtn
- Health care and education: INGOs, NGOs and national government
- Language classes: NGOs, University of Athens



INTEGRATION

- National and regional government: Ministry of Migration and Municipalities
- Access to education: access to all up to 15 years old (rights of the child)
- Access to welfare and health services: no distinction between nationals and legal migrants (though welfare services severely undercut due to the crisis)



Employment and benefits: Full access to unemployment benefits and allowances under the same condition as the Greek nationals (based on the number of work days). No access to benefits and allowances for long-term unemployment. Migrants, refugees and asylum seekers can now access training programs offered by the National Organisation of Employment (OAED), even if language barriers (courses are conducted mostly in Greek) and the lack of official recognition of the migrants', refugees' and asylum seekers' qualifications make access to these courses difficult.



• Benefits offered by the City: Legal migrants have access to all benefits offered by the City. These are benefits related to health, benefits related to housing, benefits related to transport, benefits related to unprotected children, benefits related to disability, as well as the universal Social Solidarity Fund (introduced in 01/02/2017), a new social welfare program which aims to address poverty and deprivation in a holistic manner. Services such as free meals offered by the City are available to all, regardless of legal status.



Political inclusion and participation

Migrant Integration Council (MIC): its mission is to document and examine the problems facing migrants who live permanently in the municipality regarding their integration in local society and their contact with municipal services and the municipal authority. Additionally, it can submit proposals to the Athens City Council for the development of local actions to promote the smooth social integration of migrants as well as to organize events in cooperation with the Municipality. Besides providing consultation to the City Council, the MIC aims to raise public awareness and promote social cohesion in the local community
