Mr. Peter Ainsworth is Senior Deputy Chief of the Public Integrity Section, Criminal Division, U.S. Department of Justice. He manages all aspects of public corruption investigations and prosecutions including overseeing the preparation and submission of mutual legal assistance requests and other international evidence gathering efforts. As a lead anti-corruption expert for USG delegations in connection with the United Nations Convention against Corruption and the Organization of American States Inter-American Convention against Corruption, he supervises and oversees the USG response to anti-corruption review mechanisms including the 2011 GRECO and UNCAC review. Mr. Ainsworth manages special projects aimed at strengthening US law enforcement capacity by promoting international anti-corruption efforts. He serves on the Board of Directors of the International Association of Anti-Corruption Authorities. Mr. Ainsworth works closely with officials from UNODC, World Bank, and other multi-lateral organizations in support of anti-corruption efforts worldwide.

Mr. Peter Ainsworth holds a JD degree, conferred with Honors from the National Law Center, George Washington University, Washington, D.C.
