- Technocratic process, alienated from citizens;
- Or: use and abuse of public resourses, more effective public services, merit-based recruitment, integrity

- Working groups, PAR Network "Our Administration"
- Approaching PAR from various perspectives: gendermainstreaming, service delivery to vulnerable groups

Lessons learned

- Team up with people/organizations who have the skills you are lacking
- Designers, local CSOs, media
- Be flexible, the timing is hardly predictable
- Fill the data gaps and avoid overlaps (Government official reports, SIGMA assessments, European Commission country reports, Balkan Barometer)
- Innovate: 'Mystery shopping' in Montenegrin municipalities





Lessons learned

- Use the opportunities: Special Group for Public Administration Reform, consultations with CSOs
- Transparency of EU accession is over-arching issue: peer review reports, expert missions, direct budget support for PAR





Challenges or opportunities

- Mainstreaming of PAR
- One of the three pillars of EU accession negotiations
- Catching up with benchmarks and setting new ones
- Independent monitoring
